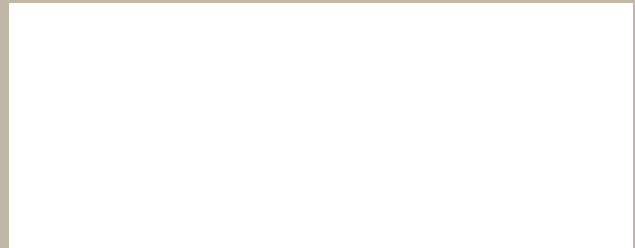

## IN-DEMAND SKILLS

The technical skills you learn as an engineer will help prepare you for a civilian career with building contractors, state highway agencies, rock quarries, well drillers or construction firms. You'll be able to consider a future as an operating engineer, heavy equipment operator, well driller or rigger.



There are a number of formal three-year operating engineer apprenticeship programs which you may qualify for as well. These programs, which are administered by the International Union of Operating Engineers and the Associated General Contractors of America, Inc., consist of at least three years or 6,000 hours of on-the-job training and 144 hours per year of classroom instruction.
